Sergeant Rios currently serves on the Executive Council of the Human Services Coordinating Body (HSCB) which is the state designated community collaborative for the county. She also is the Chair to the HSCB Portal of Services Committee which created a universal assessment or screening tool that would identify a person's eligibility for various services. Laura also Chairs the Macomb Veterans Action Collaborative (MVAC) which mission is to develop a "No Wrong Door" system of care where veterans and their dependents either receive the care they need or are referred to the appropriate resources. Some of Laura's volunteer projects include being a Post Service Officer at the VFW Old Settlers Post 4659 in Shelby Township and a Volunteer Income Tax Assistance Program Manager where she supervises 45 volunteers and prepares over a 2,300 tax returns for veterans and low income in the community.


